Organisation	Award	Project location	Project
Aberdeen City Council, Education & Sport	£5,000	Aberdeen	This project will work with children from four primary schools in the city and their families to create a book of tales incorporating traditional and modern tales from around the world. An e-book of the stories will be created. An event will be held at the end of the project for all those involved, to come together for a ceilidh of sharing. Families will provide food and dancing from their home countries.
Angus Council	£5,000	Angus	This project builds on the The annual 'Angus Sports Awards', which have been running since 1996. This year's awards will be inspired by the 2014 Games to incorporate Commonwealth and Scottish music, food and an inspiring keynote speaker. The speaker will be a Scottish athlete hoping to compete at the 2014 Games.
East Dunbartonshire Leisure & Culture	£4,275	East Dunbartonshire	Let's Celebrate Glasgow 2014 will encourage young people in East Dunbartonshire to become more active through sport and activity and to learn about the commonwealth in fun ways while playing sport. After school clubs will be run at four school locations; Kirkintilloch High School, Bishopbriggs Academy, Lenzie Academy and Merkland School. Local sports clubs will deliver coaching over four weeks and on the fifth week an event will be held to which, parents, family members and friends will be invited.
Larbert High School	£7,250	Falkirk	This school will run a series of arts, science, social study and history learning activities planned out by an Event Producer, film makers, photographers and artists who will work with 500 secondary school pupils.
Stenhousemuir Primary School	£9,625	Falkirk	This project will work with an artist to complete a photography project with children aged 3 to 12 years old from Inchlair Nursery and Larbert Day Nursery. They will photograph 2014 Commonwealth Games events in the area ending in an exhibition in the Forth Valley Royal Hospital open to the public.
St George's & St Peter's Community Association	£9,450	Glasgow	Over 40 weeks young people, aged from 5 to 16, will actively research the different cultures and traditions of the Commonwealth and develop ways to share their learning with others in their community. This could be through dance, staging a play, song or other methods which will be decided by the young people themselves. At the end of the project a celebration will be held in the St Georges and St Peters church hall to which the whole community will be invited.
St Mirin's Primary	£9,200	Glasgow	This group will organise a variety of commonwealth sports for its children. They will invite a gymnast coach over from the Danish Gymnastics and Sports Association to provide training, encourage them to try skipping, cycling and swimming and introduce them to the games of New Age Kurling, New Age Bowls and Boccia.



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LEAP	£9,960	Glasgow	This project will create a website, a physical meeting space ('a pop up centre') and a programme of events and workshops for the LGBT community during the Commonwealth Games. Many of events will have a sporting theme. They will also include live music, exhibitions, films, talks and a formal reception.
Scottish Sports Futures	£9,999	Glasgow	This project will hold an awards ceremony in the Tollcross International Swimming Centre to celebrate the work and achievements of young people and organisations involved in their 'Active East' project. The event will be open to 250 people.
Croftcroighn Primary School	£5,830	Glasgow	This school is partnered with a special needs school in Namibia. During the project pupils will take part in African and Scottish music and dance workshops. They will also create a celebratory musical dramatisation about Namibia. The project will culminate in a celebratory event for the public and partner schools in March 2014.
Glasgow Women's Library	£10,000	Glasgow	This project will work with a diverse group of women to explore the spectrum of women's creative writing from the Commonwealth. It will start by introducing women in a fun and relaxed way to authors and poets from each country, by reading selected works aloud to the group and discussing them. Individuals will then learn how to research and discover for themselves a wealth of Commonwealth women's prose and poetry.
Glasgow Chamber Choir	£7,100	Glasgow	This project will mark the Choir's 20th anniversary by delivering a "Commonwealth Choral Marathon." The Choir will perform concerts in five venues across the Glasgow area, travelling between them by bus. The concerts will be based on music from a 'Glasgow song book' which will be created for the project by 10 local composers.
277 Glasgow Company The Boys' Brigade	£1,050	Glasgow	This group will organise a three day camp in Fife in May 2014 which will end with a mini Commonwealth Games. The project will also allow the group to buy a new trophy which will become an annual award for the boy who shows the greatest citizenship or who does the most to help a charitable cause. The award will be presented to the winner at a Commonwealth themed parents night. In addition, the group will hold a Commonwealth fun day for BB groups in north Glasgow.
Magic Torch	£9,285	Greenock	This group specialises in researching and sharing traditional tales through storytelling. The project will research and write 10 traditional tales from across the Commonwealth, one tale from the local area (Gourock) and one from elsewhere in the UK. It will also contact groups in other Commonwealth countries to create a new tale with the story beginning in Inverclyde. The stories will be collated in an illustrated children's book which will be given free to local primary schools.



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Dementia Friendly Communities	£9,867	Highlands	This group will host an all abilities 'Alternative Commonwealth Games Comes to East Sutherland' event in June 2014. They will also deliver three pre-event 'heats' for people who are unable or unfit to attend the alternative games (e.g. the elderly and those with dementia). The heats, which will take place in a hospital, a care home and a school will feature activities including 'Make your own sporting scarecrow', decorating a Commonwealth hat and designing a Commonwealth flag.
East Sutherland Schools Sports Association	£7,710	Highlands	This project will deliver an extra-curricular coaching programme in Commonwealth Games sports and games for 450 primary school children aged 5 to 11 in Dornoch, Golspie, Rogart, Brora, Helmsdale, Lairg, Bonar Bridge, and Rosehall primary schools. This will culminate in a final Primary Highland Commonwealth Games event.
Kilwinning Academy	£4,000	North Ayrshire	This project will enable secondary school pupils to try seven Commonwealth sports over a week in June 2014. Coached by local clubs, pupils will have the chance to try table tennis, rugby, badminton, gymnastics, track and field, hockey, judo and squash.
Couper Angus Primary School	£7,864	Perth and Kinross	This project highlights the links between Coupar Angus and other Commonwealth Countries. It will include a series of activities, including sports taster sessions, activities exploring local history and talks from families who have moved to Scotland from other countries. An orienteering course documenting the history of Coupar Angus will also be created and information sheets placed in the local heritage centre. The project will end with a closing ceremony.
Renfrewshire Council	£9,000	Renfrewshire	This project will provide a series of leadership opportunities for young people from across primary schools and high schools in Renfrewshire. This will develop a pool of community volunteers who can ensure that sport continues to thrive following the Games. A celebratory event will also be organised.
Circle Dancing for All	£10,000	Scotland-wide	This project will increase awareness of circle dancing and music in the U.K and the Commonwealth and will highlight the cultural connections between dance and music. An experienced circle dancer will teach 10 dance teachers the 10 dances to be performed at the final event and brief them about the cultures and countries the dances come from.



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Duncanrig Secondary	£7,000	South Lanarkshire	This school will introduce and expand sporting opportunities available to pupils and establish links to local sporting clubs. Duncanrig Gets Set trail days will introduce S1 pupils to commonwealth sports. Senior pupils will be trained as coaches and when qualified will help to run new after school sports clubs. A final event, the Duncanwealth Games will be held over two days to allow approximately 900 pupils to take part in commonwealth games events and to 'represent' an adopted commonwealth country.
Kiwi pre-school playgroup	£2,145	South Lanarkshire	This project will organise a series of celebratory activities including a mini Commonwealth Games, a series of soccer sessions and a t-shirt making workshop, It will also work with gardeners from a local residents association to create a Commonwealth Garden floral display at a nearby park, which will become an area maintained by the playgroup and its parents and changed each season to give the children the chance to develop their gardening skills.
